Founded in 1807, the Boston Athenaeum is one of the oldest and most distinguished independent libraries in the U.S. Our docent-led tour will focus on the architectural

history of the Athenaeum's building and the institution's fine arts collection. After our hour-long tour, there will be

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time to explore before heading back to Cambridge. \$10/person in advance covers admission & tour. \$10/person for roundtrip taxi transportation from Apple Cinemas. Open to members.

Friday, June 8, 10:30 am - 2:30 pm Explorers Walk: Frederick Law Olmsted's Jamaica Pond



Jamaica Pond is the largest standing body of water in the Emerald Necklace. We'll take the T to Jamaica Plain and walk the 8 or so blocks to the pond. There

we'll walk the 1.5 mile long perimeter path around the pond which Olmsted framed with existing vegetation and additional trees. As we return we'll stop for a light lunch at a Jamaica Plain bistro. Meet downstairs at the main Harvard T station ticketing machines. Total walking distance: approx. 2.9 miles.

Friday, June 22, 10:45 am - 5:00 pm Explorers Walk: Ferry Trip and Walk around Georges Island (Fort Warren) in Boston Harbor



From Harvard Sq. we'll take the T to the Aquarium station to board the noon ferry for a 50-minute ride to Georges Island (snack bar and facilities on board). The

island, part of the National Park system, is dominated by the huge, granite fort built in the mid-19th century, best known for its later use as a prison for Confederate Soldiers in the Civil War. There is plenty to explore for those so inclined, and a cafe to enjoy until we return on the 3 pm ferry. Meet downstairs at the main Harvard Sq. station ticketing machines. For those who which to take a taxi to Long Wharf, meet at Apple Cinemas as 11 am (\$10/person). Ferry roundtrip ticket is \$15. Walking distance will vary by individual, 1 to 2.5 miles.
