There we'll visit the Museum with its mass of historical memorabilia, bookstore, facilities, etc. At the end of the pier, we'll board the harbor ferry (\$3.50). Upon arrival, we'll go to James Hook Lobster Shack (lunch on your own) before walking down the Rose Kennedy Greenway to take the subway home. Approximately 2.5 miles walking.


Under the guidance of CN member and crossword guru Steve

Join us for a discussion on Antonia Fraser's *Marie Antionette, The Journey*. France's beleaguered queen, Marie Antoinette, wrongly accused of uttering the infamous "Let them eat cake," was the subject of ridicule and curiosity even before her death. She has since



been the object of debate and speculation and the fascination so often accorded tragic figures in history. Open to new members, provided you have read the book by meeting time.

Thursday, July 18, 2:00pm - 3:30pm, CN Office How will we live tomorrow? A cyclist's national conversation while pedaling through the lower 48 states.

After Cambridge resident Paul E. Fallon retired at the age 60, he



turned his love of cycling into a national conversation. During 2015-2016, Paul pedaled over 20,000 miles through the 48 contiguous states and asked everyone he met, 'How will we live tomorrow?' Hundreds of strangers offered him food and shelter; thousands more shared their thoughts about "tomorrow".

At ten miles per hour, Paul was a slow moving antidote to an election cycle that highlighted our national dissonance. Yet he found generosity among people of all persuasions and discovered the strength in asking a question rather than pretending to know the answers.

Paul will share stories from his adventure with CN Members, as well as his perspectives on how cycling and conversation are satisfying ways to bring us all together.

Join some of your fellow CN members for an organized trip to Tanglewood for the BSO's concert performance of Gershwin & Stravinsky, featuring Andris Nelsons, conductor and Jean-Yves Thibaudet, piano. Monday, July 22, 10:30am - 6:00pm, Explorer Walk Ferry to Salem's Peabody-Essex Museum & train home



Meet at the Harvard Square T-station by the ticket machines to head for Boston's Long Wharf to board the Salem Ferry. (\$23 one-way). After arriving in Salem, we'll take the free trolley to the Museum (admission

\$18) to see the current exhibition: "Passion for American Art, from the Carolyn and Peter Lynch Collection" which includes works by Childe Hassam, Martin Johnson Heade, Winslow Homer and John Singer Sargent. Following will be a brief lunch in the museum's atrium. Afterwards, we'll view "Double Happiness: a Celebration of Chinese Art," before walking six blocks to the Salem train station for a ride back to Boston's North Station (\$7.50 one-way) and then take the subway home.

Tuesday, July 23, 10:45am - 2:00pm Museum of Fine Arts: <u>Toulouse-Lautrec and the Stars of Paris</u> Exhibit in Gund Gallery (LG31)

Explore Paris at the turn of the 20th century through evocative posters, prints, and paintings of Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec.

The exhibition is composed of thematic sections highlighting Lautrec's formal innovations, such as dramatic lighting effects and color combinations; the artistic and social landscapes of Paris, scenes of the city by day and by night; cafés, cabarets, and theaters; and celebrities of



the age. The display also incorporates works by Lautrec's contemporaries. Option to stay afterwards and enjoy a pay-on-your -own lunch at the museum.

Museum admission is self-pay: free to museum members; \$23 for non-member seniors (65+). The MFA museum passes from local public libraries admits up to 2 people for \$10 per person. When registering, please indicate if you wish to carpool from Apple Cinemas, as a passenger or a driver, or get to the Museum on your own. Those carpooling will meet at Apple Cinemas at 10 am. For all: meet at 10:45 in lobby at Museum's Huntington Avenue entrance. (Carpoolers: please bring cash for your share of parking fee in \$3-\$7 range.)
